As we did last year, we present here a snapshot of the financial activities of the Foundation during the previous year – what assets we received, where they came from, what money we spent or distributed, and where the money went. As you can see, we did well last year, bringing in more than \$160,000 in donations and pledges to benefit the Park District. Our Campaign for the Next Century is also doing well, moving ever closer to our campaign goal of \$2 million. Take a look in the report for more details.

Rather than talking further about numbers you can see in the pages that follow, let me focus my message this year on our fundraising efforts. Without donations, there would be no extra help for the Urbana Park District, certainly not the \$72,000 in gifts the Foundation transferred to the Park District in 2019. How can we convey our message and raise awareness? Well, we can organize events that do just that, events that help make the Foundation a more visible organization. Many of you reading this report have even attended one or more of our events – our mixer preceding the Jazz Walk in the fall, the Holiday Party we host in winter, and our Annual Dinner in the spring. Last year we added a new event to our lineup, the Barn Bash, held in early summer. The event, which features music, food, and good fellowship, was very popular and we expect to make it a regular feature.

But you can also help just by spreading the word about the Foundation and the good work it does. Attend our events. Bring your friends and neighbors. Share your love of Urbana's outstanding parks. 


Cash Donations, 2016 to 2019

The Urbana Parks Foundation financially supports the Urbana Park District through regular distributions of funds. These distributions support specific expenses which include operating expenses, youth scholarships and program support, and improvements to park facilities and park infrastructure.



CAMPAIGN FOR THE NEXT CENTURY

The Campaign for the Next Century aims to provide \$2 million in funds to support the Urbana Park District far into the future. The Campaign has three major points of focus including: **Crystal Lake Park, Youth Scholarships, and Endowments.**



Youth Scholarships

- Youth scholarships help children participate in park district programs despite limited financial resources.
- Participation of youth from all walks of life helps park programs by enriching the experience for all participants.
- Broad participation in park programs by local youth helps the community by exposing all youth to the benefits of using our parks.



Endowments

- Strengthening parks strengthens the entire community.
- An endowment broadens and deepens the base of financial support for all parks.
- Multiple donors increase the impact of any single gift many times over and in perpetuity.
- Endowments add incremental resources for the Urbana Park District in perpetuity.




Crystal Lake Park
